The enclosed tickets will admit you to High Holy Day Services. The congregation will worship in a single service and seats will be unassigned. **Admission to services will be by ticket only!**

Please be sure to bring your tickets with you to each service.

Tickets are not required for 2nd Day Rosh Hashanah Services, in the Temple Beth Israel Sanctuary.

Each two adult household membership is provided with two tickets, and each single adult household membership, one ticket.

All children, up to age 23, living in the household, are entitled to tickets upon request at no additional charge.

High Holy Day services will be held in the auditorium of Evanston Township High School, 1600 Dodge Avenue, Evanston. Convenient parking will be available in the school parking lots.

Disabled worshippers will find seating in an accessible area.

Please note: This year we will begin to use a **new prayerbook**. It comes as a set of books (one for Rosh Hashanah and one for Yom Kippur) and the TBI price is \$36 per set. It will be necessary for every worshipper to acquire a copy of *Mishkan Hanefesh* – it will not be feasible to follow the service using our former *Machzor*, *The Gates of Repentance*, and **we will not have a supply of loaners available.**

If you no longer desire to keep your copy of *The Gates of Repentance*, we will collect them at Temple.

Young Families Holiday Service (appropriate for children age 5 and under)

Family Service (geared for children who are able to read)

At the conclusion of the Family Service, parents and children 4th grade and up are invited to join the Congregational Service in the auditorium. There will be age appropriate programming for children in Pre-K-3rd grade led by TBI staff.
